In other news: Chapter 15, a feasibility study of the SS Mountains to be conducted by the State Department of Rec and Parks is in progress. A tour, set up by Doris Murphy and Janice Minkston, will show the visiting men around.

A new committee of Mary Gorman, Helen Treend, and Nancy Woogerd has been established to follow up letters to Sacramento and other government agencies.

Cathy Guilmette, our entrant in the Seventeen Magazine ecology contest, did not place. However, we congratulate her for outstanding contributions to SSMP which will not soon be forgotten. We hope she and her family continue to inspire other park activities.

Options in progress: An M.A. I. appraisal of the 178-acre old Stage Coach site must be gotten before we can obtain options on the property. This is necessary to make us eligible for matching state or federal funds. Zelma Skillman, Lois Scott, Mary Gorman, and Janice Minkston are working to get the appraisal at less than the normal \$500. fee.

With the passing of a new city ordinance requiring a \$200 building fund tax per unit, money should be accumulating for park expenditure. Letters, however, are in order to Councilman Wilkinson asking for high priority status for the 178-acres.

Volunteers are needed for a new telephone committee.

Word comes from Dr. Joseph Pampalone, owner of the chamber of commerce building in Chateworth, that our office which he has donated will be plastered this week. A painting crew of SSMPA members will then be able to ready the office for a grand opening.

Summer activities in the air: Janice Minkston announces that no general meetings are expected during the months of July and August, however board meetings will be held as needed. A social evening, a campout in the SS mountains, and a picnic are being discussed for the members.
